Needless to say the State will disburse the incentives to the petitioners in accordance with law.

W.P.No. 5683(W) of 2016 is disposed of without any order as to costs.

The petitioners are similarly situated and circumstanced as that of the writ petition in W.P.No. 5685(W) of 2016. The petitioners complain that incentives already granted are now sought to be realised from the petitioners.

Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that, the petitioner herein were given the incentives under the UGC Regulation, 2000 as well as UGC Regulation, 2010. Subsequently, the State has revisited the pay-fixation of the petitioners and have withdrawn the incentives without assigning any reason.

The State and the UGC Authorities are represented.

In W.P.No. 5685(W) of 2016 I have held that the petitioners were entitled to the incentives as given by the UGC Regulation 2000 and UGC Regulation 2010. I have directed the authorities to disburse such incentives within a period of six weeks from the date of the order.

In view of the my judgment and order dated August 02, 2016 passed in W.P.No. 5685(W) of 2016 (Prof. Debashish Mahapatra & Ors. Vs. State of West Bengal & Ors.) the order
